Preserve, Manor & District Trail Info

The Preserve District is on the eastern side of RiverTown in between the Preserve, Manor and High Pointe neighborhoods. The majority of uplands in this area are comprised of pine flatwoods that served silviculture purposes prior to RiverTown developing around it. The area also surrounds a large open wetland that provides habitat for many species. There are multiple trails to choose from and all trail distances are measured from the primary trailhead.

Slash Pine is the dominant species within the area, and the planted rows of timber are still noticeable. The traits of this plant community vary greatly with the soil conditions, topography, and on-going maintenance. The groundcover is mostly covered with gallberry, saw palmetto, and bracken fern. Historically, wildfires would burn across these flatwoods every few years, keeping the height of the groundcover relatively low and the species diversity relatively high. With the suppression of wildfires in this area, the plant community has not been able to follow a more natural path of succession.
